

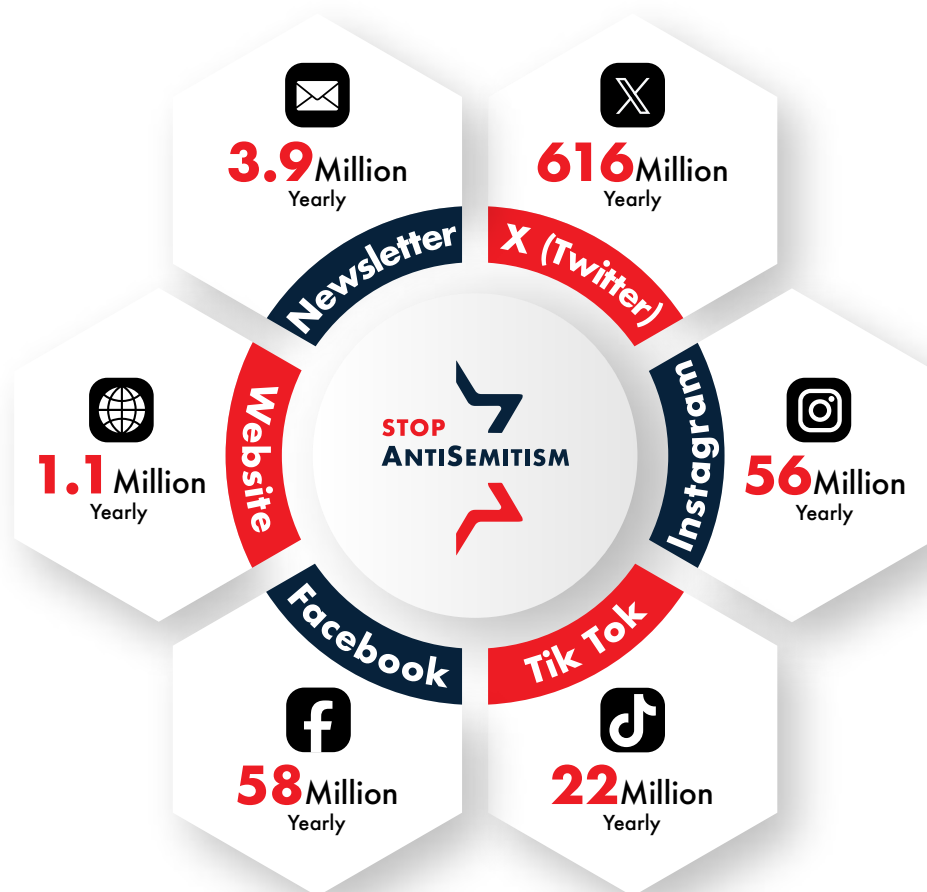


OUR **POWERFUL REACH**

In 2025, StopAntisemitism leveraged an unmatched digital footprint to turn exposure into accountability. Across our newsletter, social media platforms, and website, we generated nearly one billion impressions and direct engagements.

This scale is not just visibility, but rather influence in action. When we expose antisemitism, the world sees it in real time, creating immediate public pressure that institutions and employers cannot ignore.

Our reach is the driving force behind our results. No other antisemitism watchdog or advocacy organization commands this level of sustained, multi-platform engagement, and that is precisely why we are able to achieve consequences and accountability at a scale others simply cannot.



StopAntisemitism serves as a resource to anyone who wants to stand up against hate. There are multiple ways in which people can report incidents of antisemitism 24/7, including our website and social media channels.

Once an incident is reported, StopAntisemitism mobilizes. Depending on the situation, this includes but is not limited to:

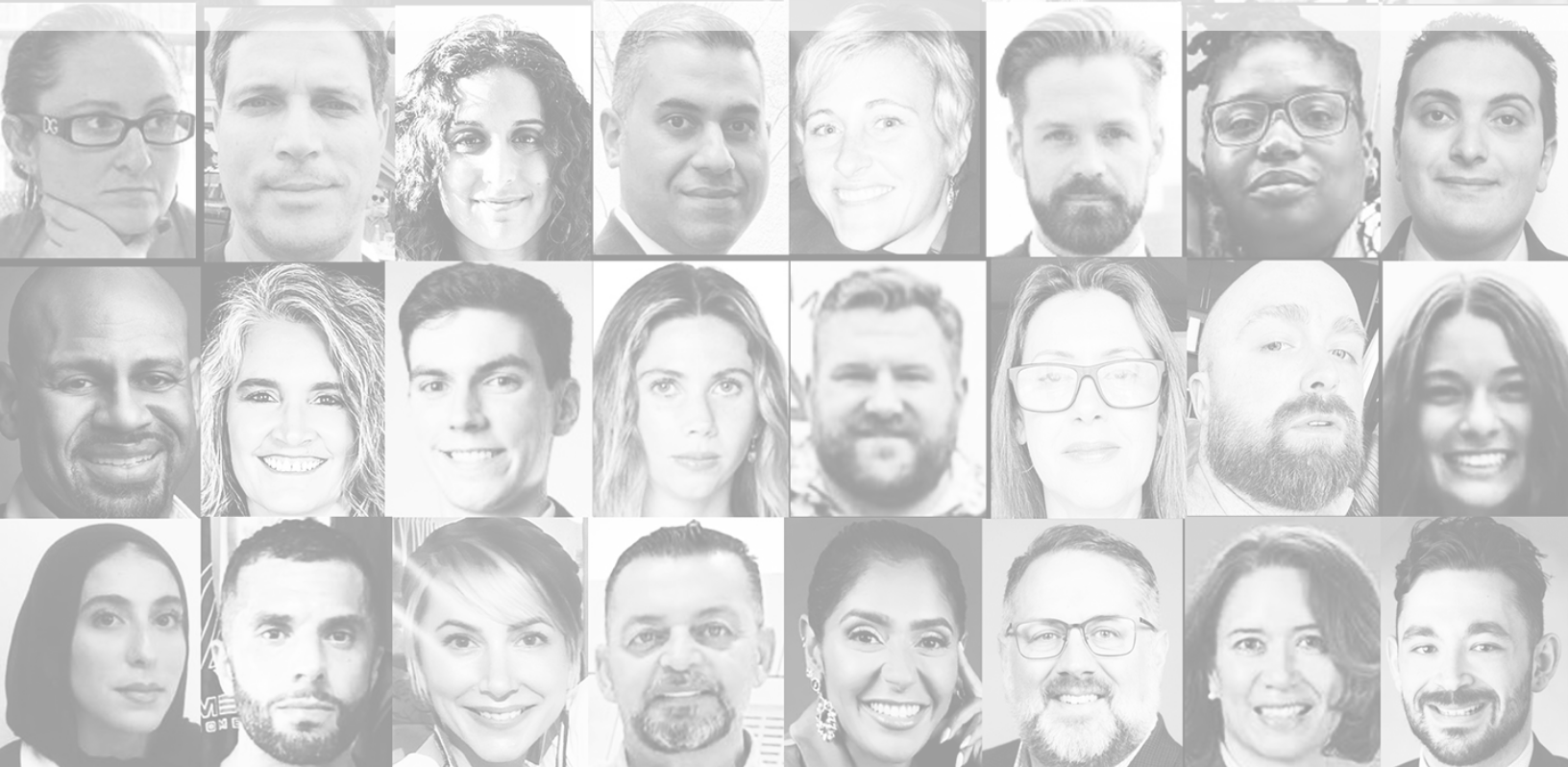
- **Gathering** all information around the circumstances to create a meaningful call to action.
- **Vetting** all relevant details for accuracy and ensuring that all the facts of the incident are consistent before any action is taken.
- **Liaising** with law enforcement.
- **Engaging** press and exposing the information on social media.



OUR **IMPACT**



IN 2025, STOPANTISEMITISM DELIVERED CONSISTENT, HIGH-IMPACT WINS INCLUDING WEEKLY FIRINGS, SUSPENSIONS, EXPULSIONS, AND ARRESTS.



StopAntisemitism drove real-world consequences for antisemitism across key sectors. Investigations, digital campaigns, and direct engagement with employers and institutions led to significant professional accountability.

2025 By the Numbers

- 142 antisemitic professionals featured
- 109 actioned (terminated, suspended, or placed on probation)
- 77% overall accountability rate

Sector Impact **Healthcare:**

- 56 professionals featured | 38 actioned (68%)

From physicians to nurses, those entrusted with patient care faced consequences for antisemitic conduct, reinforcing that hate has no place in medicine.

Sector Impact **Education:**

- 27 professionals featured | 23 actioned (85%)

Teachers, administrators, and staff shaping the next generation were held accountable, sending a clear message: antisemitism in classrooms and campuses will not be tolerated.

Sector Impact **Technology:**

- 37 professionals featured | 26 actioned (70%)

Tech employees promoting antisemitic content were exposed, and corporate responses showed growing intolerance for hate speech in innovation-driven industries.

Sector Impact **Finance:**

- 22 professionals featured | 22 actioned (100%)

Accountability was absolute—every individual faced consequences, highlighting the sector's recognition that antisemitism violates public trust and fiduciary duty.

These results show exposure drives consequences and consequences deter hate. StopAntisemitism remains committed to ensuring antisemitism carries professional, reputational, and institutional costs.



BOB VYLAN – MUSICAL ARTIST

Bob Vylan publicly called for the death of the Israel Defense Forces during a performance at the Glastonbury Festival. Following StopAntisemitism's involvement and public pressure, **the U.S. Department of State revoked Bob Vylan's visa**, barring the group from entering the United States.



NEA – ANTISEMITIC CURRICULUM MATERIAL

National Education Association, the nation's largest teachers' union representing over three million educators, circulated and hosted materials for Indigenous Peoples' Day that erased Israel entirely from the map. After StopAntisemitism's campaign and public pressure, **the NEA removed the offensive content and altered the map**, acknowledging it violated standards against antisemitism.



RISD – ANTISEMITIC ART SHOW

Rhode Island School of Design, an affiliate of Brown University, faced backlash after a student display promoted violence against Jews and called for the removal of Israel. After StopAntisemitism's campaign and public pressure, **RISD shut down the antisemitic display**.

ARRESTS



JONATHON WAGNER – CARDIAC TECHNICIAN

Jonathon Wagner, a cardiac technician from Baltimore, Maryland, targeted a Jewish-owned business in a violent antisemitic attack. Wagner vandalized the property with faux blood, destroyed Israeli and U.S. flags, and damaged security cameras. After StopAntisemitism exposed the incident, **Jonathon Wagner was arrested and charged** with multiple counts of malicious destruction of property, including charges based on race and religion. As a result of StopAntisemitism’s work, Jonathon Wagner was fired from his position with Johns Hopkins Medicine.



IMAN ABDUL – POLITICAL ORGANIZER

Iman Abdul, a New York City–based political organizer, was arrested for inciting violence against a Jewish school. Abdul publicly posted the name and location of a Jewish high school and urged followers to attack it, directly endangering minor children. Following StopAntisemitism’s reporting, **Iman Abdul was arrested and charged** with making a terroristic threat, aggravated harassment, acting in a manner injurious to a child, and making a threat of mass harm. As a result of StopAntisemitism’s work, Iman Abdul faces multiple felony charges.



PHILIP DE LA ROSA – ANTISEMITIC THREAT SUSPECT

Philip De La Rosa was arrested after StopAntisemitism exposed his violent harassment of a Jewish woman in Dallas, Texas. De La Rosa followed the victim, hurled antisemitic slurs, mimicked shooting gestures, and repeatedly threatened to kill her. Working with local authorities and the Dallas Jewish Federation, law enforcement intervened swiftly. As a result of StopAntisemitism’s work, **Philip De La Rosa was arrested and charged** with making a terroristic threat.

StopDontShop, an initiative of StopAntisemitism, holds antisemitic business owners accountable by exposing their behavior and informing the public.

In 2025, we featured over 160 businesses with documented antisemitic actions. Thanks to our StopDontShop (SDS) feature, when consumers Google these businesses online, our coverage often appears, letting the public know how these companies treat Jewish people.

By increasing visibility and accountability, StopDontShop ensures that antisemitism in commerce carries consequences, protecting both consumers and the broader community.

STOPDONTSHOP SAMPLE WINS



APPARITION RUM & CIDER BAR – DISCRIMINATORY BAN

Apparition Rum & Cider Bar, owned by Michael Valentine, sparked outrage after banning “Zionists” from his establishment while promoting antisemitic rhetoric and comparing Jews to Nazis. After StopDontShop’s campaign and public pressure, **Apparition Rum & Cider Bar announced it would permanently close.**



HAIRLOVE STUDIO – REFUSAL OF SERVICE

HairLove Studio faced backlash after its hairstylist, Brett Casey Jones, refused service to a Jewish client, stating he would not serve “Zionists”—a form of discrimination that is illegal in Ohio. After StopDontShop’s campaign and public pressure, HairLove Studio **terminated Brett Casey Jones.**

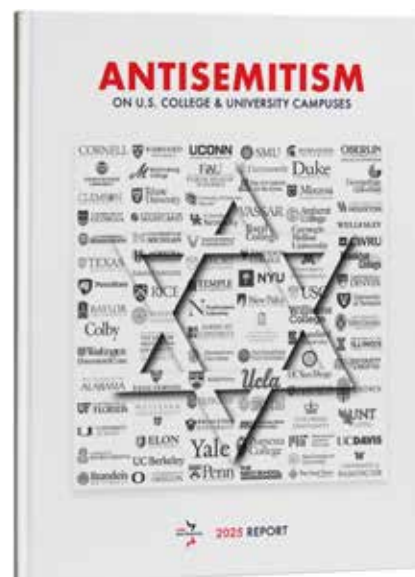
For the fourth consecutive year, StopAntisemitism has published its Antisemitism on U.S. College & University Campuses report, offering a critical, data-driven assessment of 90 colleges and universities and the safety of Jewish students.

Why This Matters: Antisemitism on campuses is systemic and often unaddressed, affecting student safety, identity, and well-being. Many Jewish students face harassment, blame for Israel's actions, and hostile environments—forcing them to hide their identity or avoid certain spaces.

For high school students and families, this report is an essential tool when choosing a school, highlighting which institutions prioritize safety and inclusion and which fail to protect Jewish students.

Key Findings Include:

- **58%** of Jewish students experienced antisemitism, and **62%** were unfairly blamed for Israel's actions.
- **39%** hid their Jewish identity, while **65%** felt unwelcome on campus.
- Only **12%** of incidents were effectively addressed by administrations.
- Coordinated protests and harassment occurred at over **140** campuses, often politically motivated.
- **14** campuses received failing grades for inadequate protections.



2025 **ANTISEMITE OF THE YEAR**

StopAntisemitism features an Antisemite of the Week nearly every week, exposing those who promote antisemitism and holding them publicly accountable. Each weekly feature builds awareness and culminates in our **Antisemite of the Year (ASOTY)**, spotlighting the individual whose actions most impact Jewish communities over the year.

In 2025, Tucker Carlson was named ASOTY, highlighting his repeated promotion of antisemitic narratives to a national audience. Carlson's platform reaches millions, amplifying harmful stereotypes and contributing to a climate where antisemitism is normalized.

Our ASOTY feature is a cornerstone of StopAntisemitism's work, consistently grabbing global attention and shining a light on individuals who spread hate.

By calling out Carlson and those like him, we ensure that powerful voices cannot normalize hate without scrutiny or pushback.



StopAntisemitism was featured in more than 270 pieces of news coverage with a combined total reach of 500 million people, including:



LOOKING AHEAD

In 2026, StopAntisemitism will expand its impact into new areas while strengthening our work in existing spaces. We are entering the K-12 arena, focusing on protecting Jewish students in younger schools and providing families with the resources they need to make informed decisions and ensure safe, inclusive learning environments. At the same time, we are building stronger allyship with Christian partners, fostering a united front against antisemitism and amplifying our collective ability to confront hate wherever it arises.

We will also deepen our efforts in the spaces where we are already active, holding colleges, businesses, and public figures accountable while empowering the public to take action. Through these initiatives, StopAntisemitism will continue to protect Jewish communities, educate the public, and drive measurable change, creating safer and more inclusive environments nationwide.
